

Notice About 2026 Tax Rates

Property Tax Rates in Wilson County

This notice concerns the 2026 property tax rates for Wilson County.

This notice provides information about two tax rates used in adopting the current tax year's tax rate. The no-new-revenue tax rate would impose the same amount of taxes as last year if you compare properties taxed in both years. In most cases, the voter-approval tax rate is the highest tax rate a taxing unit can adopt without holding an election. In each case, these rates are calculated by dividing the total amount of taxes by the current taxable value with adjustments as required by state law. The rates are given per \$100 of property value.

Taxing units preferring to list the rates can expand this section to include an explanation of how these tax rates were calculated.

This year's no-new-revenue tax rate \$.402607 /\$100

This year's voter-approval tax rate \$.424932 /\$100

Voter-Approval Tax Rate Adjustments

State Criminal Justice Mandate

The Wilson County Auditor certifies that Wilson County has spent \$ 0.00 (minus any amount received from state revenue for such costs) in the previous 12 months for the maintenance and operations cost of keeping inmates sentenced to the Texas Department of Criminal Justice. Wilson County Sheriff has provided Wilson County information on these costs, minus the state revenues received for the reimbursement of such costs. This increased the voter-approval tax rate by \$ 0 /\$100.

Indigent Health Care Compensation Expenditures

The County of Wilson spent \$ 326,879 from July 1 2025 to Jun 30 2026 on indigent health care compensation procedures at the increased minimum eligibility standards, less the amount of state assistance. For the current tax year, the amount of increase above last year's enhanced indigent health care expenditures is \$ -4,971. This increased the voter-approval tax rate by \$.0000 /\$100.

Indigent Defense Compensation Expenditures

The County of Wilson spent \$ 190,679 from July 1 2025 to June 30 2026 to provide appointed counsel for indigent individuals, less the amount of state grants received by the county. In the preceding year, the county spent \$ 263,207 for indigent defense compensation expenditures. The amount of increase above last year's indigent defense expenditures is \$ -72,528. This increased the voter-approval rate by \$.000255 /\$100 to recoup the increased expenditures.

Eligible County Hospital Expenditures

The County of Wilson spent \$ 0.00 from July 1 2025 to June 30 2026
on expenditures to maintain and operate an eligible county hospital. In the preceding year, the County of Wilson
spent \$ 0.00 for county hospital expenditures. For the current tax year, the amount of increase above last year's expenditures is
\$ 0. This increased the voter-approval tax rate by 0 /\$100.
